


Finding Articles in Google Scholar

According to Google, Scholar “provides a simple way to broadly search for scholarly literature. From one place, you can search across many disciplines and sources: articles, theses, books, abstracts and court opinions, from academic publishers, professional societies, online repositories, universities and other web sites.”

Much of the content in Google Scholar is not freely available. If it is, you will see a link labeled **[PDF]** to the right of the search result.

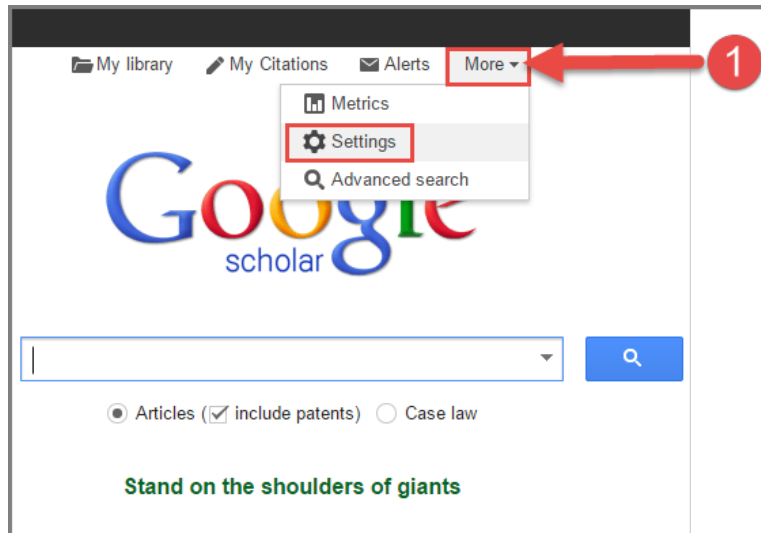


The screenshot shows a Google search for "googling ethics" on the Scholar tab. The search results are as follows:

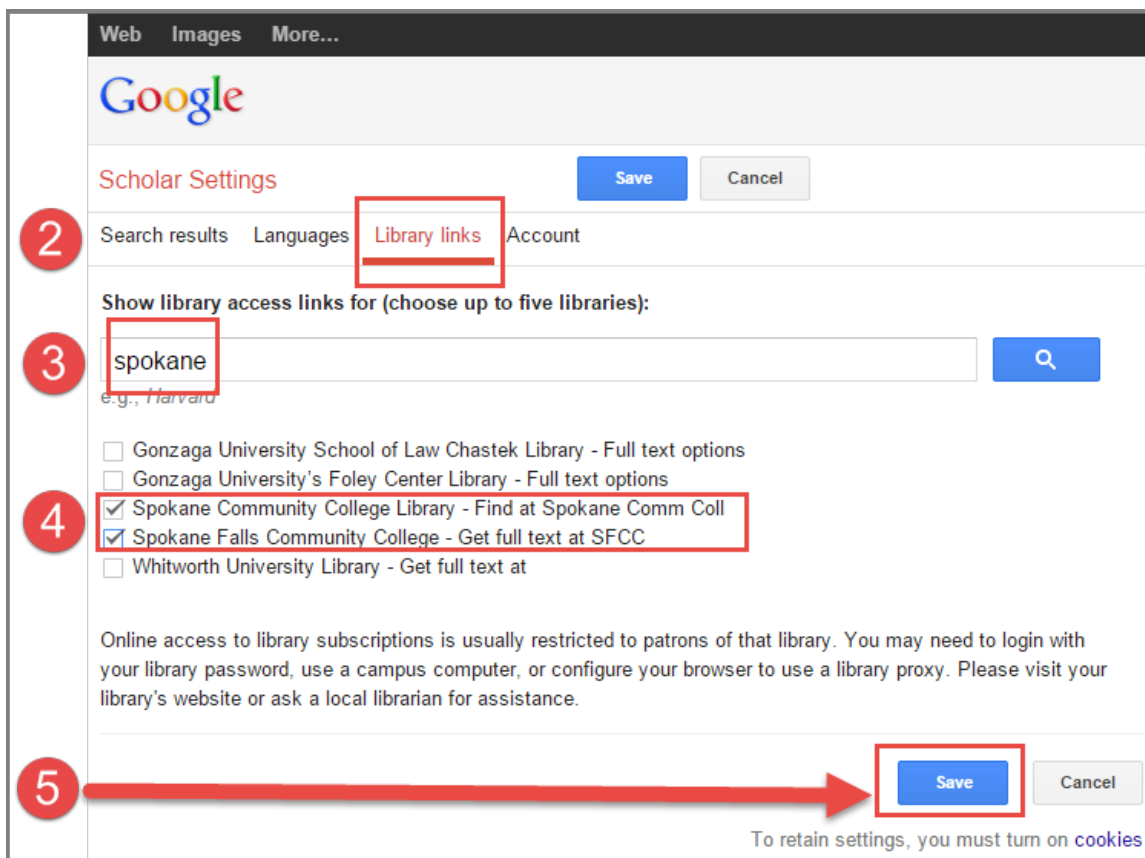

You can also configure Google Scholar to see if our library has to the full-text online. Follow these steps:

1. In Scholar (<http://scholar.google.com/>), select **More > Settings**



2. Select **Library Links**
3. Search for “spokane”
4. Check **Spokane Community College Library** or **Spokane Falls Community College** (depending on the institution to which you belong)
5. Click **Save**



Now when you do a search in Google Scholar, you will see either **Find at Spokane Comm Coll** or **Get full text at SFCC** appear (again, depending on the institution to which you belong).
